VERWOOD SOLAR FARM

This summer the Verwood Solar Farm Committee awarded £5,000 to the Memorial Hall towards the cost of solar panels, £1,200 to Forest FM to give training opportunities for those interested in radio presentation, £1,000 to Hillside School towards play equipment and £200 to Emmanuel Middle School for gardening tools and seeds. This allowed a variety of crops and flowers to be grown.

The committee meeting dates for 2019 are 28th January, 13th May and 7th October, application forms to be received no later than two weeks before these dates. Forms are available on-line under Verwood Solar Farm on the Town Council website and can be submitted by email (preferably) or a printed version can be obtained from the Town Council Office.

VERWOOD FRIENDSHIP CLUB

The Verwood Friendship Club is a friendly social group, mostly made up of the more senior members of society, who meet on a monthly basis for companionship and entertainment. It was formed in 2010 out of the Verwood Disabled Club and is run by a dedicated committee of volunteers and helpers in order to give the elderly residents of Verwood and surrounding villages quality time to meet up and socialise with people with similar interests.

They currently hold their meetings at Meadow Court in Newtown Lane, Verwood, on the first Thursday of every month from 2 – 4pm. This usually takes the form of an interesting talk given by a visiting speaker or a musical entertainer followed by tea and cakes/biscuits which are served by a group of friendly helpers. Upholstered seats and armchairs are set up in groups around tables to give our members the maximum comfort in cheerful surroundings.

During the summer months they also have a number of half day coach outings to various places of interest culminating in a stop for a tasty cream tea. A New Year lunch in a hotel is also an added event during the second half of January.

Whilst the Club continues to be popular with its members the current volunteers are finding it more and more difficult to give them their full support as many of the helpers are themselves approaching the stage of life where their mobility is less than it used to be. They are therefore looking for more helpers, in particular those who can move tables and chairs in readiness for their monthly meetings.

The Club is also looking for volunteers to be available on a regular basis to drive the local Age UK's mini-bus for them. Some Members are able to make their own way to these meetings but many have no such means and are either collected from home by individual volunteer car drivers or in the mini-bus. Although Age UK are happy for the Club to continue using their bus they can no longer guarantee the provision of a driver every month and that in future they are likely to have to supply their own. As a consequence this puts additional strain on those helpers with cars having to make double runs to ensure those wishing to attend are delivered safely to their meeting place.

VERWOOD MEMORIAL HALL

The Mayor attended the re-opening event of the Memorial Hall on 10th September following a one-month closure during August as this is the only time when major work could be carried out without inconveniencing regular hirers.

The obsolete chimneys have been removed, flat roofs have all been insulated and re-covered, solar panels installed and, whilst internally the Elizabeth Room has a new level ceiling with inset dimmable LED lighting and a chimney breast removed. There's a new boiler and two radiators installed on the stage; the last of the old metal windows has been replaced and a new ventilating window put in the kitchen. There is now new china and cutlery in the main kitchen to cater for up to 120 people. Both the Town Council and the Verwood Solar Farm Committee contributed £5,000 each towards the total cost of £65,000 which the Committee feel is a worthwhile investment when the hall is such a popular venue for clubs, micro businesses and parties.

There is currently a vacancy for a Public Representative on the Committee and it is hoped that someone might like to take this opportunity to actively support this much loved venue.

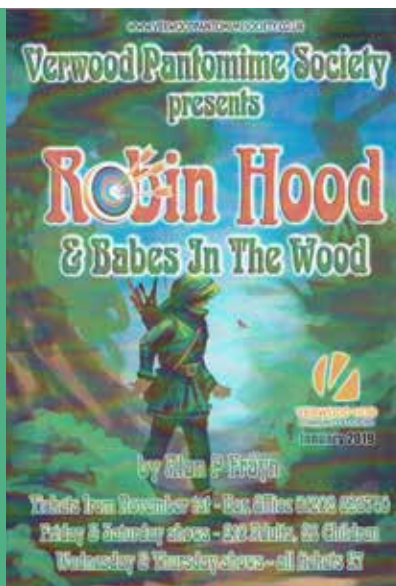
