However, we have had a busy summer with several successful events – the Royal Picnic in the Park to celebrate the Coronation of King Charles III in May, followed by the Verwood Carnival and then the Rotary Rustic Fayre on August Bank Holiday. POLICE REPORT

It has continued to be a busy summer across Dorset with our Neighbourhood Teams working collaboratively with other agencies and stake holders committed to keeping our communities safe with exceptional local Policing.

We have been successful with regard to targeting persistent Anti-Social Behaviour and dealing positively with a core group of young people. As a result, we have seen a massive drop in ASB-type incidents allowing our small team to tackle our local priorities.

This has included a pioneering Community Payback Initiative whereby young people were asked to clear up areas of littering and other ASB activities. This proved extremely successful, giving them a sense of achievement whilst educating them on the importance of working together to improve the environment for all.

We also see the retirement of PCSO Andy Flanagan who has served Dorset Police in both Police Officer and Police Community Support Officers roles spanning more than 30 years. We wish him well in his well-deserved retirement.

VERWOOD HEATHLAND HERITAGE CENTRE

Like many other organisations in Verwood, the Heritage Centre was badly affected by the pandemic and is now recovering slowly. Chairman Gordon Thorne has resigned due to health problems and Chris Thorne is the new Chairman.

In July, Chris and his brother Jamie Thorne, who are now overseeing the Heathland Heritage Centre, arranged a meeting for Friends of the Centre and anyone interested in the Centre and its future. There were lots of comments about how the centre works, its use and possible changes but the most surprising comment was:

There are residents who do not know what the building next to the car park is and have never been in the Centre or the museum.

The museum is in the original pottery building and has been carefully preserved. Although the building is very small, the display of life on the Heathland is amazing. There is also a large display of Verwood Pottery, pottery being one of the industries for which Verwood is known. It is a gem and apparently almost an unknown gem! Entry to the museum is free and the café at the front serves tea, coffee and lovely cakes. The Heritage Centre has hosted family gatherings, post funeral gatherings and meetings of local groups and there are all manner of local as well as some family history records. It exists for everyone who lives in Verwood. If you and your family have never visited the Heathland Heritage Centre, you are in for a treat! Go and see Verwood Pottery, have a drink and some cake and see the latest display.

The Centre is open Monday to Saturday 9.30 to 12.00.

VERWOODIANS ON WASTE

Local eco group Verwoodians on Waste (VoW) have been awarded a generous grant by The Verwood Solar Farm fund of nearly £1,000 to spend on litter picking equipment. Sarah Cudmore, VoW's litter picking co-ordinator is delighted.

Following the success of Cllr Simon Gibson's monthly litter picking initiative, it has been clear that local people want to help keep Verwood and Three-Legged Cross a special place to live and work but Saturday mornings are not always convenient for them. Those who want more flexibility can now have a picker on permanent loan in order to collect unsightly litter on an ad-hoc basis, either working alone or with others.
