

We have continued to work hard across East Dorset keeping our communities safe by putting Victims first and relentlessly pursuing criminality. In the last few months, we have seen a significant reduction in Anti-Social Behaviour across all our 'hotspot' areas.

We have recently welcomed PC Sam Berry to the team on attachment from another department. He's already been out and about dealing with core offenders whilst supporting force wide operations as far away as Weymouth.

We have continued to work closely with Dorset Council Community Safety Team in securing a further CCTV camera located in Manor Road near to Ferret Green. Our monthly drop in Community Contact Engagements at the Hub have continued to become increasingly popular, providing advice, reassurance and recording crimes. VERWOOD SOLAR FUND

The Verwood Solar Farm Fund has grants available to help finance projects or events that would benefit the community of Verwood

The Committee welcomes applications for grants from community groups and organisations within the locality of Verwood.

Grant applications need to be received, ideally, at least two weeks prior to a scheduled meeting of the Committee. Application forms can be obtained on-line via the Town Council website under Verwood Solar Farm, the applications can then be submitted by email. Alternatively, a printed version can be obtained from the Town Council Office.

GRANT AID

Verwood Town Council are accepting applications for Grant Aid up until 1st Sept 2023.

Grant Aid funding is available for community organisations who can demonstrate a clear need for financial support. The organisation must be either charitable or non-profit making, it must have clearly written aims and objectives, a constitution and membership rules. Each organisation can only make one application per year from the Town Council.

Deadline 1st September.

Bunker open day - Join Moors Valley Rangers on 17th June from 10am to 2pm to go back in time and follow in the footsteps of the service people whose job it was to direct enemy attention away from wartime RAF airfields. No need to book, just turn up on the day!

Summer Gala - Join the Moors Valley Railway team 17th June from 10.30am to 5pm for their Grand Summer Gala. One of the most popular events of the year with steam traction engines, classic cars, tractors, military vehicles, model railway exhibition and much more!







Out in the Forest, discover the **Play Trail** with its unique pieces of wooden play equipment. You can wriggle through giant snakes in the 'Snake Pit', attempt the 'Crocodile Crossing' and balance on the fallen forest of 'Timber'. The trail is only a mile long but with so many exciting pieces of play equipment, you should allow at least an hour to complete it all. The trail is suitable for pushchairs and most mobility scooters.

There are two imaginative play areas close to the Visitor Centre:

The Adventure Play Area, designed especially for older children, includes a zip slide, huge space net, climbing boulder, and a fortress of towers and crossings with a long tube slide.

Younger children will be enthralled in the **Castle and Sandworks Area** with its gentle slides and swings, all set inside a safe sand area so don't forget to bring your bucket and spade too!
